Paraprofessionals play an essential role in fulfilling our mission at American Nicaraguan School. Paraprofessionals model language fidelity and partner with students who are becoming academically bi-literate in English and Spanish. They also teach and reinforce the skills and strategies from the lesson when supporting individuals and groups of students in language development. Paraprofessionals support the formative process of observing and recording the development and mastery of skills. In addition, Paraprofessionals play an important role in the supervision and nurturing of our students throughout their day.

Qualifications for Paraprofessional:

Qualifications:

- → Possess a minimum of a high school degree.
- → Have at least one year of proven experience working in early childhood or primary education, child development, or a child-related field.
- → Very strong English language skills and willingness to commit to using only English to promote a supportive English immersion model of language acquisition.
- → Have an awareness of the unique needs of young children and have appropriate expectations of their abilities.
- → Possess a strong work ethic, be punctual, and have minimal absences.
- → Have familiarity with ANS school and its programs
- → Ability to work independently and with a team
- → Desire to learn and develop teaching skills (currently working on or has a teaching degree)

Required Expectations:

- → Be an instructional agent to support teaching and learning
- → Ensure the safety and well-being of each child by responding to their emotional, social, and physical needs as well as their educational needs.

- → Utilize developmentally appropriate practice and best practice methods at all times.
- → Be warm and nurturing with children, but respect standard child-protection guidelines to include not holding children on your lap, not being alone with children in restroom facilities, and modeling safe boundaries with children.
- → Be a positive role model for all staff and children.
- → Be an advocate for excellence in education and be professional in your dress, talk, and actions. Cell phones are not to be used while on duty.
- → Adhere to guidance and feedback from coaches and administration.

Responsibilities and Duties:

- → Be an advocate for the Community of Practice that defines what teaching and learning look like in our Language Development Programs.
- → Assist in planning high-quality instruction in the philosophy of the Language Development Program Community of Practice
- → Implement instructional plans, as designed by the language learning teachers K-12, to support individual and small group instruction, as well as co-teaching
- → Be prepared to substitute for language learning teachers as needed K-12
- → Support instruction by preparing essential materials and organization of materials for language units and class sessions and help set up classroom space
- → Help maintain and organize language programs files and data
- → Believe in and implement an effective and supportive English or Spanish Immersion experience for your students to acquire high levels of English or Spanish language skills under your instruction. Use best practices to support language fidelity and language acquisition.
- → Utilize every possible moment to engage in conversation with children to show them that what they have to say is valued (arrival, mealtimes, outdoor choice time, etc.).
- → Assist in supporting inquiry-based learning by helping to prepare engaging and rich environments that support the study topic and investigation questions.
- → Receive and implement language development strategies through professional development
- → Appropriately supervise children while keeping them safe at all times



- → Establish a professional level of rapport with each family to provide quality care and friendly service.
- → Create and maintain an environment that is clean, organized, and safe for all children
- → Meet with the Language Learning Coordinator and Language teachers weekly to review responsibilities and study/prepare to be able to fulfill your roles and responsibilities in the classroom throughout the day.
- → Maintain a professional self-image and project the values of the organization at all times

Please know that these qualifications and expectations are meant to describe the position and do not include every detail of the position. However, the Paraprofessional must understand that our goal is to build an educational program of excellence. We all demonstrate a commitment to the Community of Practice of the Primary School.
